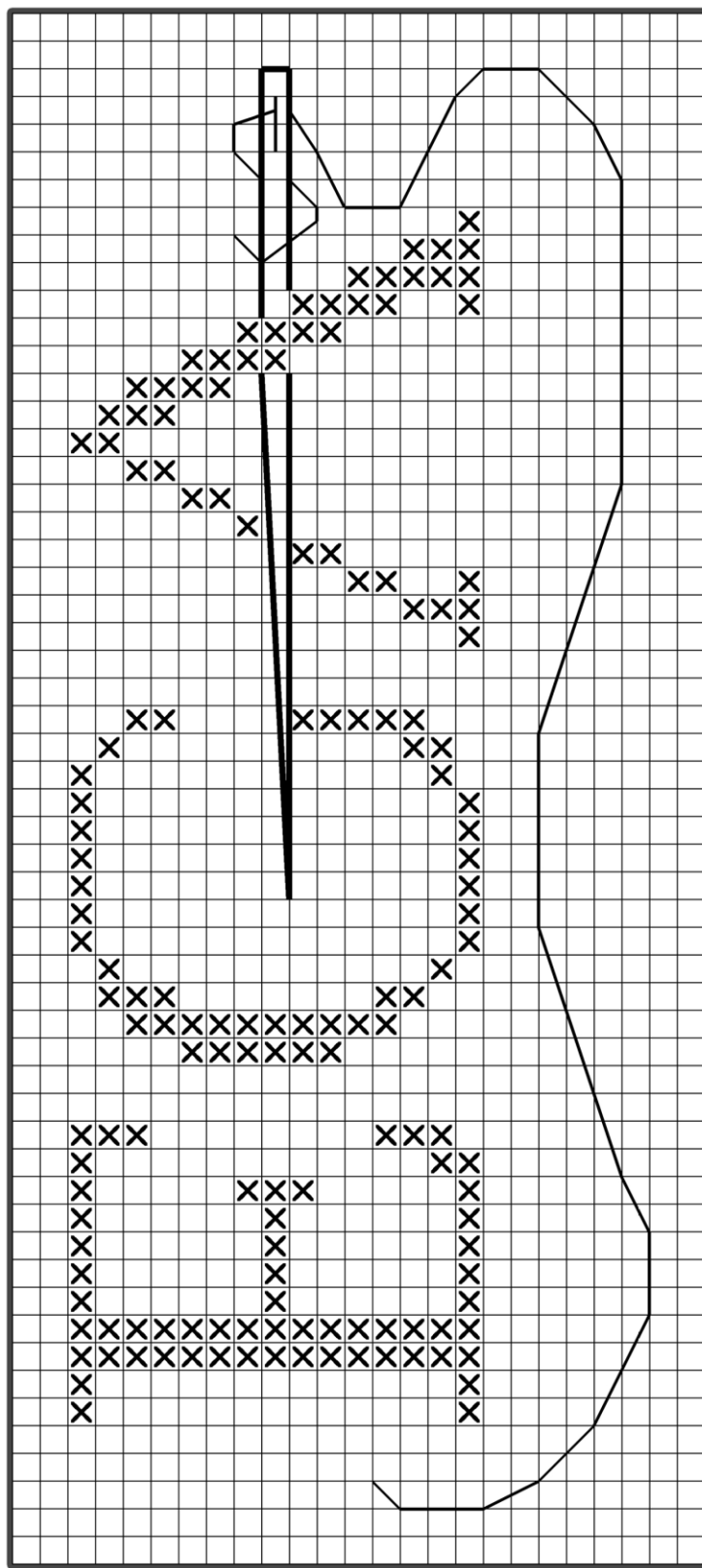

## Chart Colors

EGA's primary colors create the needle and thread lettermark.

- = EGA Green: DMC® 3347, Whipped Backstitch

## Stitch Count

21H x 52W

## Finished Size

- 14/28 Canvas/Fabric: 1.5" x 3.7"
- 16/32 Canvas/Fabric: 1.3" x 3.2"
- 18/38 Canvas/Fabric: 1.2" x 2.8"
- 20/40 Canvas/Fabric: 1" x 2.6"

## Additional Brand Colors

All of the secondary brand colors can be used together or individually in a broader design to complement the primary colors.

- EGA Purple: DMC® 3746
- EGA Yellow: DMC® 728
- EGA Orange: DMC® 722
- EGA Soft Blue: DMC® 3841
